

Dress Code

There is strong support from parents and staff at South Halls Head Primary School for the wearing of a school uniform.

We believe the uniform helps to promote school pride and encourages students to feel part of a cohesive and supportive community. It promotes unity.

A school uniform helps to develop an understanding of the importance of personal neatness, appearance, presentation and self-discipline. It allows our students to be easily identified and thus promotes a safe environment.

It is an important learning experience for all students who will one day enter the workplace where the attributes mentioned above are highly valued.

The School Board has endorsed the dress code. All students must adhere to the code.

The following items form our school uniform (dress code) –

- School polo shirt (long or short sleeve)
- School dress
- Navy blue shorts/skorts/long trousers/track pants/school micro fibre pants
- School micro fibre jacket/ navy jacket
- School broad brimmed/bucket hat
- School faction polo shirt (worn Fridays and faction carnival days only)
- Footwear – sneakers/joggers (blue, black, white preferred) or sandals with back straps (navy, black or brown) or black school shoes.
- Accessories to be blue, white, black or grey in colour (e.g. socks, hair ties/ribbons)

It is not permitted to wear the following items to school

- Jewellery (except ear studs/sleepers, watch). Cultural or religious symbols can be worn (at discretion of the Principal)
- Denim
- No thongs or croc/reef type sandals
- No fluorescent shoes or shoelaces
- Makeup, nail polish, fake nails, excessive hair gel, coloured sun cream/zinc
- Logos on clothing (except school logo)
- Hair longer than shoulder length should be tied back
- Natural hair colours only

Exemptions to the above can be provided at the discretion of the Principal.
